

SBNN QUALITY ASSURANCE EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM.

WORK REPORT FOR 2013

The year started on 7th January 2013 and ended on 22nd November 2013 with normal three successive breaks of approximately 3-5 weeks each.

As a tool of monitoring and evaluating the education quality of the 28 schools in West Nyakach Division, I (George Migwambo) the QAF had the responsibility to visit all these schools at least three times per term. The main objectives of the visits were mainly to-;

- i. To check the extent of teacher-pupil contact time.
- ii. For quality assurance assessment.
- iii. For motivational talk.
- iv. To check the attendance of pupils and teachers.
- v. To check the extent of syllabus coverage.
- vi. To attend to open days (as may be organized by the schools)

Even though the year was a little bit shortened by occurrences like the general elections of March fourth 2013 and the National teachers' strike, our programme managed to move as was planned with all the schools visited 3 times per term.

Teacher-pupil contact time, teachers' and pupils' attendance, syllabus coverage, parents' involvement to school activities improved to 75% as compared to 67% of last year.

During the SMC elections held at the beginning of this year, the attendance of parents was 85%, an indication that the attitude of parents is positively changing and they now feel as owners of their respective schools. All attributed to the open days introduced by SBNN from 2011.

Various meetings were also held/attended throughout the year eg staff, sports committee, SBNN-Kenya/Board/CFDC, KEPSHA meetings with the following aims/agenda.

- To discuss the way forward for the implementation of quality education in all schools.
- To act as a forum for sharing views with an aim of achieving the national goals of education.
- To have an annual work plan for the committee.
- To sensitize parents and teachers on the need to make West Nyakach schools child friendly.
- Create awareness on the importance of pupils' involvement in co-curriculum activities and teachers' directives on the same.
- To analyze the schools' proposals and qualify them for various support depending on their priority areas.

Co-curriculum activities were also held during the year. We started with ball games where the winners were all awarded with uniforms then there was a marathon on 21/9/2013 where the winners were also honored by medals, track suit etc. Such activities are very necessary since they help to break the classroom boredom among the learners, makes learning real, acts as a forum for sharing views among the teachers, pupils and a motivating factor for both the teachers and learners.

All projects carried out by SBNN can be summarized into 3 main categories namely-;

- a) Quality projects/ Education circumstances.
- b) Health projects.
- c) Infrastructural development.

QUALITY PROJECTS

This project mainly concerns with the pupils enrollment, school management committee, Teaching staff, teaching time, attendance of teachers and pupils, teaching / learning materials, school library and KCPE candidates 2013.

In the year 2013, the total number of children in the 28 primary schools (class 1-8) were 7392 of whom 3718 were girls and 3674 were boys. From the figure above, the enrollment of girls is 44 pupils more than boys. This indicates and supports SBNN's aim of prioritizing the education of the girlchild.

As compared to last year. The ECDE enrollment 2013 is 1196 boys and 1125 girls totaling to 2321 kids.
